Teton Literacy Center just completed an incredible year of record breaking success! Your contributions, volunteer hours, support in the community, and belief in our mission made this success possible. Thank you for supporting our efforts. We are thrilled to celebrate our achievements:

- We raised over \$1,024,000 in our “For the Love of Literacy” campaign to sustain programs in the climate of state and federal budget cuts.
- We provided over 30,971 hours of literacy support to students in our community, a 38% increase from last year and the most hours provided in TLC history.

4. We value collaboration with our community and volunteers as a way to provide the highest level of services and expand our students' world view.



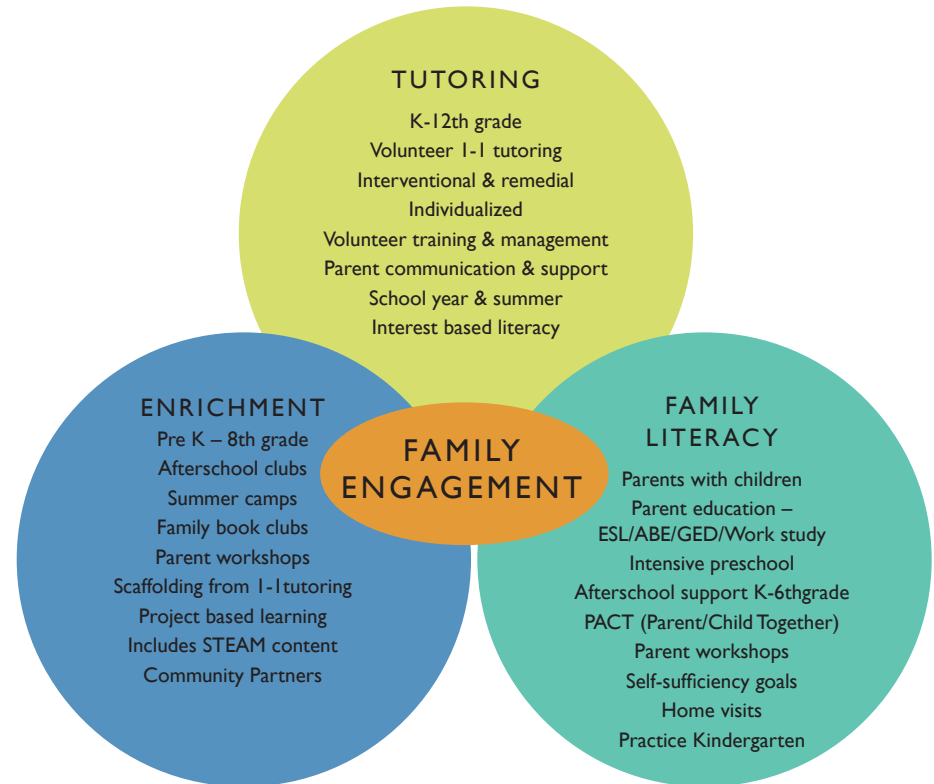
Thank you to our Board Members for their service!

Student Success and Impact

100% of students in TLC programs increased literacy levels.

96% of Enrichment Program Students and 78% of Tutoring Program students were reading at grade level at the end of the academic year.

100% of children in the Literacy Lab preschool program demonstrated emergent reading behaviors by the end of the year. Behaviors include: reading books on their own, enjoying stories, understanding and matching rhyming words, and putting events in order.

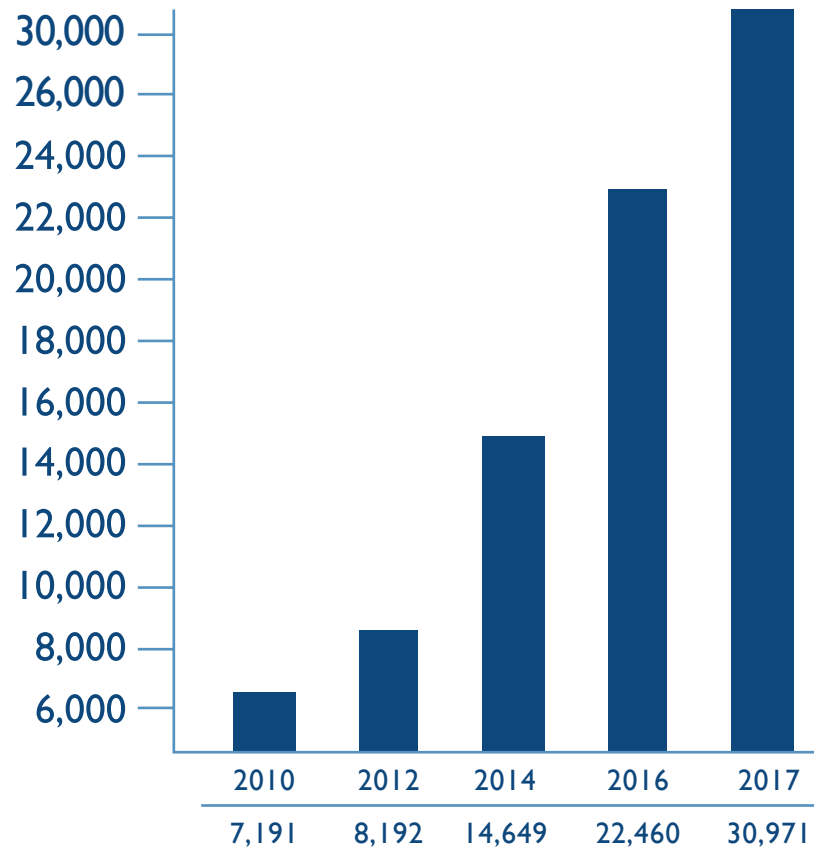
76% of Lit Lab preschool students were able to read Kindergarten level texts, performing 5 months above grade level.

100% of volunteers felt successful in improving the literacy skills of the students they worked with and wish to continue volunteering.

80% of TLC students read at home at least 4 times a week after attending TLC programs, compared with 43% before starting programs.

An Inspiration

Colter is going to be a 1st grader! Mid-way through the school year, his parents came to TLC concerned that he was not making the necessary gains to be ready to move forward.

With the support of a 1-1 tutor, a small group tutoring session led by TLC staff and an afterschool enrichment club, he was able to build comprehension, fluency and accuracy skills in reading. He worked with his tutor on reading and writing sight words and developing a passion for books. Colter is ready to succeed in 1st grade.

Did You Know?

The 2016 Wyoming PAWS assessment illustrated that **42% of 3rd graders** and **47% of 6th graders** were below proficient in reading.

A Family Success Story

Servanda has been part of TLC programs for 8 years. Her children, Brian and Ariana, attended Tutoring, Family Literacy and now Enrichment Programs. Servanda comes weekly in the evenings to work on her own literacy goals in our English classes. One week, Servanda stood in front of our attendance graph where students place their own stars for their attendance, and looked at the teacher, stating very proudly, “I have been to class 8 times in a row without missing one!” The teacher immediately congratulated her and asked her if she felt she was improving on her English language skills. Servanda stated that she is now writing in English every day, thanks to her English journal, and is able to work on homework together with her children with much more ease. Servanda’s oldest son is now in college and she is working to currently support Brian in high school to prepare for college success.

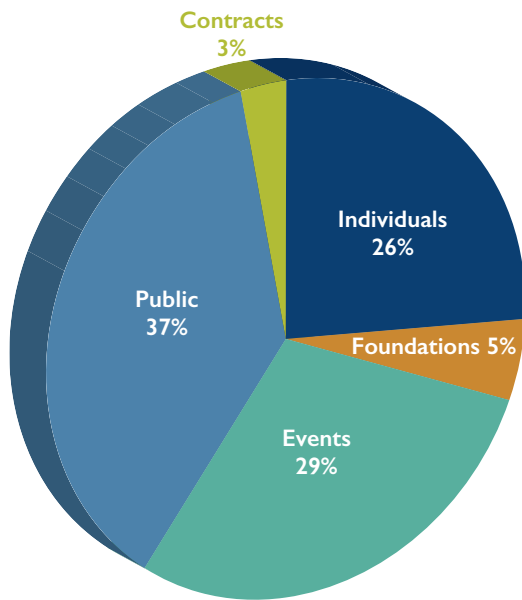


An Enrichment Story

Revenue Sources

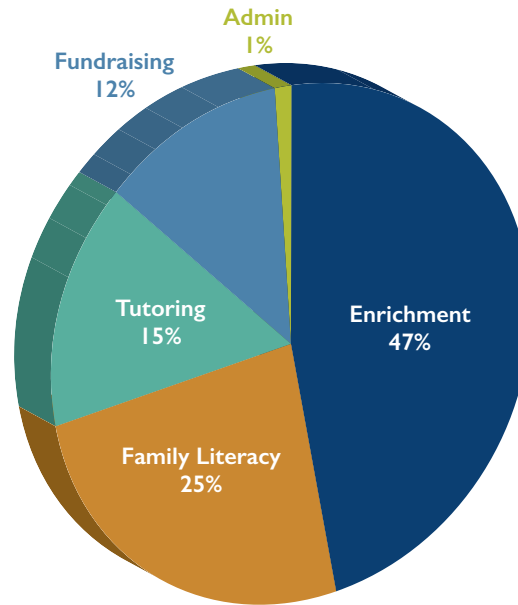


Total Revenue
