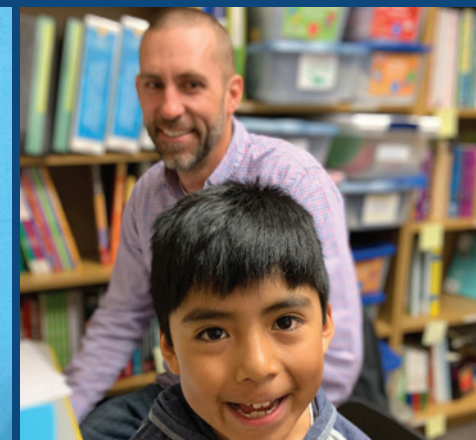
STUDENT STORY

In early 2021, long-time TLC tutoring student Gia, who was then in 8th grade and failing most of her classes, came to a TLC staff member with the announcement that she was planning to drop out of school. TLC staff lept into action, with each staff member immediately writing her a personal letter of encouragement. Then, we matched Gia with a volunteer tutor for the year. In doing so, TLC and her tutor were able to provide Gia with the one-on-one mentorship, tutoring and encouragement she needed.

Fast forward one year and Gia is absolutely thriving in high school. She finished her freshman year, passing with

flying colors, played basketball, ran track, went on college tours and volunteered in TLC's afterschool clubs. We can truly say that Gia spends every moment at TLC that she is not in school or playing sports. When she had a home basketball game, the TLC staff was there to cheer her and our other TLC students on, as was her tutor. To top it all off, this summer Gia will be working for TLC as a Rising Educator in our SOAR program. We know that Gia's participation in our tutoring program and her relationship with both her tutors and TLC staff has made an incredible difference in her life. We are thrilled to have played a role in her transformation and cannot wait to see the big things she accomplishes!

TLC is providing engaging and enriching after school programs for many children. The learning is fun and interactive. Children are gaining vocabulary and experience in the clubs. Those fortunate enough to have tutors are really benefiting because of the one-on-one attention.

TLC announced a new collaboration this year with Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to provide free, high-quality books for all children in Teton County. The missions of both organizations passionately focus on literacy and access to books. **The Imagination Library partners with local affiliates, like TLC, to mail free books each month to children all over the world.**

Teton Literacy Center serves as the access point for families with children from birth to four years of age to enroll and receive free books. Families can enroll online at tetonliteracy.org or through the Imagination Library website. Families can also come to

TLC to complete a paper registration form. All families in our community are welcome to enroll in this free program.

TLC is working with community partners to promote this opportunity to families with young children. In collaboration with St. John's Health, newborn babies will receive a new book and information on how to enroll in the program when they leave the hospital. Systems of Education and other early childhood providers are also supporting in spreading the word.

This partnership with the Imagination Library is funded through the generous support of the Nelson Schwab Family Foundation.

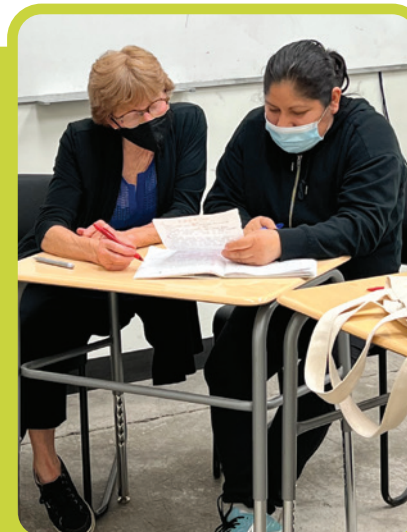


FAMILY FOCUS

Enrichment Program

COMMUNITY PILOT

In the Spring of 2022, TLC, alongside Teton County School District and Jackson Hole Children's Museum, launched a collaborative pilot program to expand the reach and depth of our afterschool Enrichment clubs. And what a success it has been!

With 11 TCSD paraprofessionals supporting TLC and JHCM club teachers, TLC was able to expand not only the number of clubs offered to families, but also the number of students enrolled in each club. These collaborative efforts resulted in **an 80% increase in the total number of students enrolled** in our Spring afterschool clubs, allowing us to serve **67% more Teton County families** than we

did in the spring of 2021.

Further, not only were we able to offer more spaces, but with two educators in each club, we were able to enhance the quality of literacy, math, social-emotional and project-based learning instruction and support in each club. Overall, **TLC provided 154% more hours of high-quality direct service** to students as a result of this pilot program.

Overall, we are thrilled with the success of this pilot and are excited to move forward with the same structure in the coming years as we know it will only help us continue to serve the critical need for quality after school opportunities in our community.

Summer SOAR 2021

TLC recognizes the critical opportunity that summer provides for students, thus we have worked to develop a comprehensive summer program with various opportunities. We have expanded our summer efforts to serve Pre-K through 11th grade students. The SOAR program is the core of TLC's summer, providing an intensive math and literacy program for exiting K-7th grade students for eight weeks.

In addition to SOAR, TLC also offers tutoring and Practice Kindergarten programs during summer months.

SOAR at TLC students illustrated an average of 4 months growth in reading and math during the summer, as compared to the two to three-month skill loss that students face without access to summer learning opportunities nationally.

Student Story



Melanie ended the 2020-2021 academic year well below grade level, as illustrated by TLC and TCSD's academic year data. COVID-19 concerns publicly resulted in

fewer supports than usual for Melanie. Excitingly, Melanie and her sister returned to SOAR in 2021 and over those eight weeks, Melanie managed to make thirty months of growth in both math and reading! Melanie entered 3rd grade approaching instructional level. She truly thrived in the program, standing out as a class leader, and consistently diving into challenges that allowed her to be extremely successful. Melanie is a great example of TLC's efforts to combat summer slide.

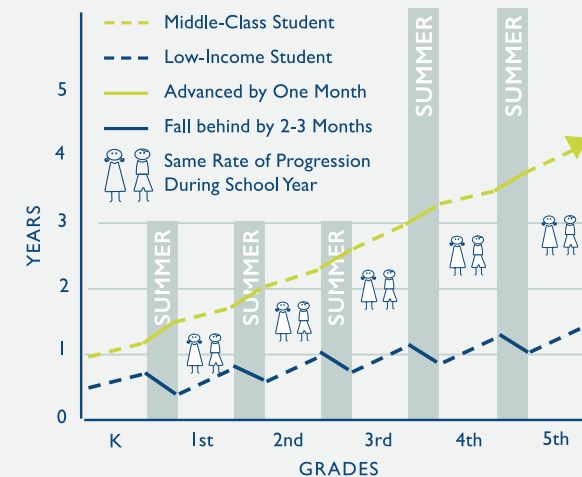

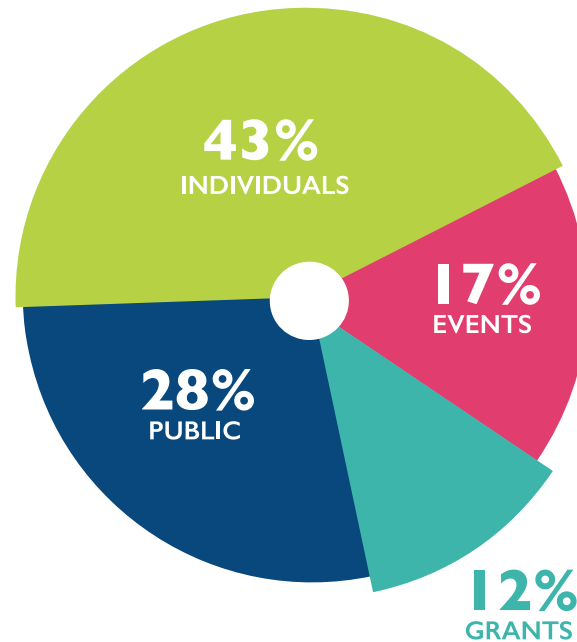

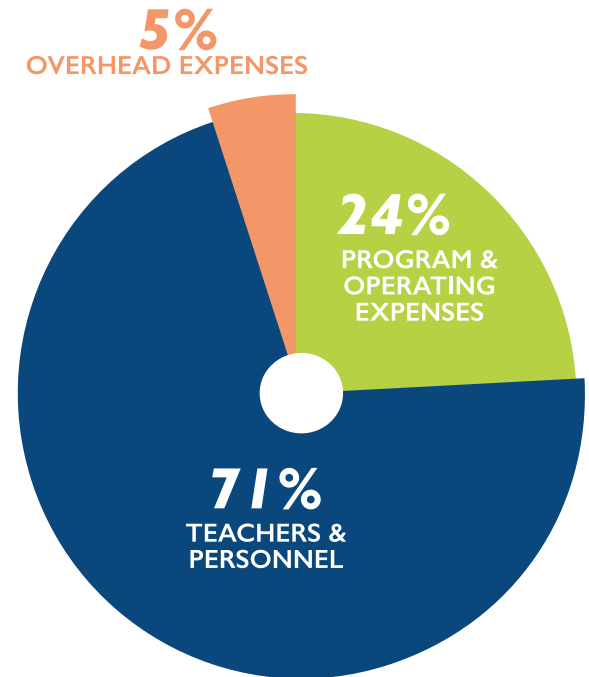
Revenue Sources

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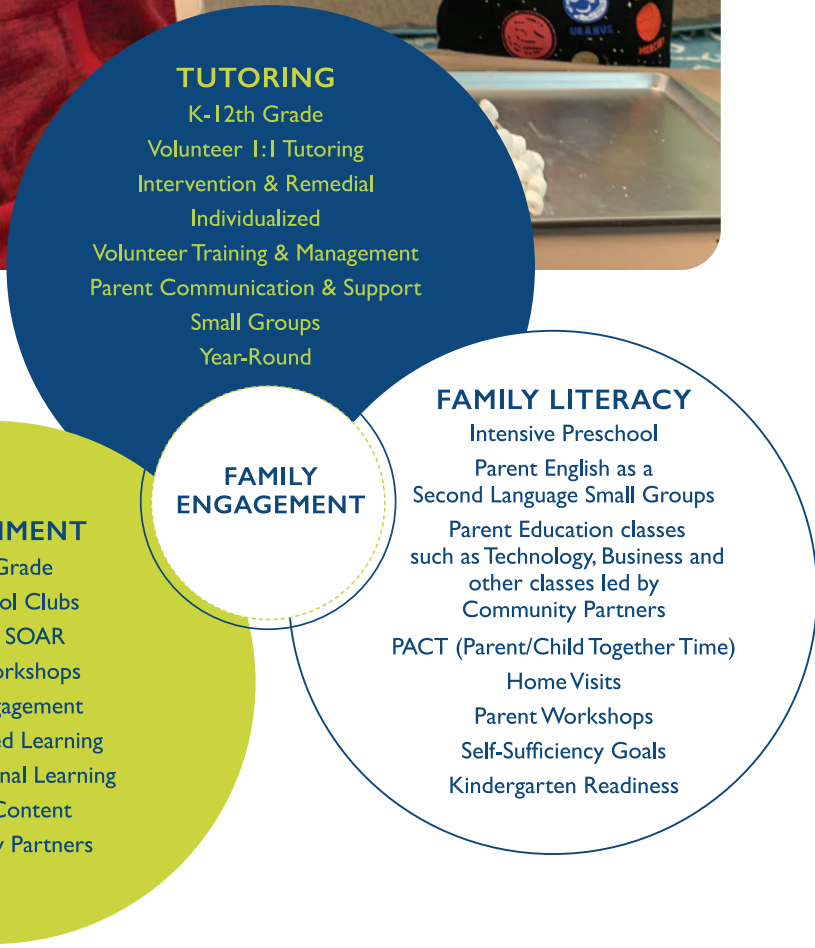
