

Student Success Stats:

- 100% of families increased their communication to their child's teacher by using their English skills and tools provided by ESL instructor.
- 100 % of TLC preschool students were able to write their name at the end of the school year compared to 11% at the beginning of the year.

A Family Success Story

Nikol Merino is a student in our TLC Lit Lab Preschool Program. Before TLC, she had never been to school before. Her parents only have an elementary level education, but they recognized and felt strongly about the importance of education. Thus they sought out pre-academic support for their daughter.

Nikol entered the school year a few weeks late, and at first she needed assistance with regular school routines. She worked extremely hard to succeed in Lit Lab. She now can write her name, write and tell a story with a message, and communicate with her teachers and friends. She is now a leader in the classroom. Nikol graduated from our Lit Lab program and is ready to succeed in Kindergarten next year!




- On average, an Enrichment student made 12 months of growth while participating at TLC.

Students have absolutely loved our Spy Club (or Spy Academy as they call it) and it has proven to be a very engaging way of providing literacy and STEM skills. Every week students complete their "Weekly Mission" from the Spy Academy Director, partaking in activities such as navigating laser courses, inventing gadgets, using finger and footprints, writing in hidden ink, deciphering codes and working as a team to save Teton Literacy Center from the hands of enemy spies!

Financials 2017-18



Teton Literacy Center is a 501 (c)3 non-profit organization that has operated through the generosity of this community since 1992. Located in Flat Creek Business Center at 1715 High School Road # 260, we own our building and operate rent free. We derive our revenue from charitable giving by individuals, foundations, family trusts, community organizations, corporations, and state literacy programs. The generous support from our funders enables us to offer our programs free of charge.

(This does not include non-operating revenue of \$5,819 of interest

and \$82,000 of donations to the Sustainability Campaign)

What's Next for TLC?

TLC has worked diligently for the last 25 years to increase the literacy skills in our community. In 2016 TLC formed the Community Needs Task Force with staff, board and community



members to review current programs, identify gaps in programs and data collection, and draft proposals for quality improvement measures.

Out of these conversations, we developed the three-phase quality improvement initiative:

- 1. Increase intensity and academic rigor
- 2. Increase middle and high school academic support
- 3. College and career readiness

Teton Literacy Center is wrapping up an exciting summer filled with learning, exploring, and applying 21 st Century skills. This past year we piloted academic initiatives that increase the intensity and depth of the TLC impact. One of the first steps taken was to create an 8 week intensive summer program to combat the "summer slide" in literacy and math. These new efforts are an evolution of the Board of Directors at Teton Literacy Center to deepen the impact of programs and support children for their entire academic career, preschool through high school. Our ultimate goal is to prepare students for post-secondary success in college or beyond. We plan to do this through an integrated summer and school year programs in collaboration with existing program in our community and our school district.
